- Homework needs to be completed by the following Friday. The children will be tested on their spellings on a Friday.



What we are studying

Maths

In Maths, we will begin to look at using a formal written method for multiplication. It would be very beneficial for the children to be confident with their times tables (in particular their 3, 4, and 8 times) during this unit so please practice as much as you can at home.

We will also look at division and ways in which we can use partitioning to divide larger numbers.

We will then move on to look at height, length, mass and capacity.



English

Our class novel this term will be 'The Firework Maker's Daughter' by Philip Pullman. The book follows the story of Lila, who wishes to be a firework maker, and her quest to make that happen.


Linking with adventure stories, we will be using Lost and Found by Oliver Jeffers in our English lessons to explore this genre more.

The children will learn about the different features, including the use of speech, and will have a go at creating their own adventure stories.



Other curriculum areas

- In Science, we will be looking at what darkness is and different light sources.
We will also carry out investigations linked to reflections and shadows.
- In D.T, we will be designing new playground equipment.
- In French, we will be learning the names of different animals.
- In Computing we will be focusing on net searches and how to keep safe online.
- We will be discussing our Dreams and Goals in PSHE.



History

Our History this term will focus on 'Ancient China'. We will be learning about the Shang Dynasty and the impact of discoveries/ inventions, which were created in these Ancient times, have on life in China and its culture today.
